I. Admission Requirements

1. An international applicant must meet the following requirements to be able to apply for admission to the University:
 1. **The applicant may not have the nationality of the Republic of China (ROC), as defined in Article 2 of the Nationality Act.** However, if the applicant was originally an ROC citizen but has lost his/her ROC nationality, as approved by the Ministry of the Interior, for a period of less than 8 years (as of the beginning of the semester), he/she may not apply for admission to the University as an international student.
 - ※ Pursuant to Article 2 of the Nationality Act of the Republic of China, a person shall have the nationality of the Republic of China under any of the conditions provided by the following:
 - (1) His/Her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China when he/she was born.
 - (2) He/She was born after the death of his/her father or mother, and his/her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China at the time of death.
 - (3) He/She was born in a territory of the Republic of China, and his/her parents cannot be ascertained or both were stateless persons.
 - (4) He/She has undergone the naturalization process.
 2. **The applicant does not hold the status of an Overseas Chinese Student.**
 3. The applicant does not hold the citizenship of Hong Kong, Macau, or the People's Republic of China.
 4. The applicant must not have been previously expelled by a college or university in the Republic of China.
 5. Nationals who have been recommended by foreign governments, organizations, academic institutions and other cultural and educational organizations to study in Taiwan through cultural cooperation agreements with Taiwan may be exempt from the provisions of items 1 and 2 above.
2. The applicant must meet the admission requirements for the intended degree program:
 1. The applicant must have graduated from a university or independent college recognized by the Ministry of Education:

An applicant applying for a Master's program must be a university graduate; an applicant applying for a Doctoral program must hold a Master's degree.
 2. The applicant must possess academic qualifications equivalent to those of the ROC.
3. The applicant must meet the requirements specified by the relevant department as indicated in the Admission Brochure.

1. The present student recruitment is conducted pursuant to the Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, amended and promulgated on January 18, 2008 by the Ministry of Education.
2. **The diploma or other academic documents, official transcript and financial statement submitted by the applicant must first be validated by an ROC overseas representative office (a validation stamp is required).**
3. A foreign national of Chinese descent who does not possess ROC nationality should apply for admission based on the provisions of either "Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan" or "Regulations Regarding Study and Counseling Assistance for Overseas Chinese Students in Taiwan," depending on his or her own status and conditions. The applicant may not apply for admission as both an overseas Chinese and an international student simultaneously. Violation of this provision, once confirmed, shall result in the revocation of the student's admission qualifications or his or her disciplinary dismissal.
4. A person who has previously been admitted to and enrolled in a Taiwanese university but was subsequently required to withdraw from the program may not apply to this University as an international student based on the provisions of the "Tainan National University of the Arts International Students Admission Guidelines." An applicant or student who has been confirmed to have violated this regulation shall have their admission qualifications revoked or receive disciplinary dismissal:
5. An applicant is permitted to apply for admission to only one department, institute or program.
6. Applicants who have not been admitted to the University following the initial or second review shall be notified in writing by the Registration Section. However, all applicant documents that have been submitted for review will not be returned to the applicants.
7. The following apply to international students applying to study in Taiwan: (1) A student who has completed a bachelor's or more advanced degree in Taiwan and wishes to continue his or her graduate studies (Master's or above) may apply for admission to a graduate program with the diploma awarded by a legally registered public or private university or independent institution, along with the official

complete transcript. He or she is exempt from submitting proof of highest academic degree attained at a foreign academic institution or the associated official complete transcript. (2) A student who has completed a bachelor's or more advanced degree at Tainan National University of the Arts and wishes to continue his or her graduate studies (Master's or above) at this University may apply by submitting the diploma awarded by this University along with the official complete transcript, but shall be exempt from submitting a photocopy of his or her passport and proof of highest academic degree attained at a foreign academic institution.

8. Following an international student's admission to the University, if he or she is found to be ineligible to apply with the claimed status, or has submitted documents that are false, forged, borrowed, altered, or possess invalid academic qualifications, his or her admission qualifications shall be revoked, or the student shall receive disciplinary dismissal. In the event that the circumstances described above are revealed subsequent to the student's graduation from the University, the student shall be demanded to return his or her diploma and the associated degree shall be revoked. In addition, the withdrawal of the student's graduation status shall also be publicly announced.

X. Grievance Procedures

If applicants have any concerns regarding the results and other matters of the review of their applications, they should submit the causes of their concerns with supporting information to the University's Registration Section within 1 month of the announcement of the list of admitted applicants. The University shall process the request in accordance with applicable regulations. Anonymous complaints will not be processed.

XI. Notes of Student Registration

1. Newly admitted students should report to the University in accordance with the procedures specified in the notices of admission and submit the following for verification. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of their admission qualifications. Delay in reporting to the University shall be construed as the students' voluntary forfeiture of their admission qualifications.

 - (3) One copy of the complete official transcript for the degree issued by the foreign academic institution and verified by the relevant ROC representative office abroad. (If the transcript is in a language other than Chinese and English, a Chinese translation should be provided.)
 - (4) Financial statement verified by the relevant ROC representative office abroad: original.
 - (5) Entry/exit record issued by the National Immigration Agency, Ministry of the Interior (photocopy of passport with entry/exit records while studying overseas.)
 - (6) Proof of insurance coverage such as medical and accident insurance and National Health Insurance; the insurance coverage should be effective throughout the entire period of the student's study in Taiwan. If no such proof is provided, the student will be required to pay insurance premiums at the time of registration for the enrollment in a mandatory insurance program.
2. An international student reporting to the college or university shall be allowed to enroll in the current semester if one-third or less of the first semester in the current academic year has not elapsed. If more than one-third of the first semester of the academic year has elapsed, the student will be allowed to register for the second semester instead.
3. The registration and course selection procedures as well as the amount of tuition and fees or credit tuition that apply to international students are identical to those for ROC citizens.
4. Prior to November 30 of each year, the University shall produce a roster of registered international students containing the name, nationality, year of study, enrolled department, institute or program for each student, and whether he or she is a recipient of the Taiwan Scholarship Program or international student scholarships sponsored by the Ministry of Education, and should be submitted and reported to the Ministry of Education for future reference.

Tainan National University of the Arts International Students Admission Guidelines

Approved by Academic Affairs Meeting held on May 29, 2003

- Article 1 These Guidelines have been established pursuant to Article 5 of the Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, Ministry of Education.
- Article 2 The term "international students" used in these Guidelines refer to persons who neither possess Republic of China (ROC) nationality nor the status of overseas Chinese students. However, if the applicant was originally an ROC citizen but he/she lost his/her ROC nationality, as approved by the Ministry of the Interior, for a period less than 8 years he/she may not apply for admission to the University under the conditions of these Guidelines. Nationals who have been recommended by foreign governments, organizations, academic institutions and other cultural and educational organizations to study in Taiwan through cultural cooperation agreements with Taiwan may be exempt from the preceding provisions. The proviso of the period of eight years in paragraph 1 shall be calculated as of the date of registration for international students, as specified by the University.
- Article 3 The number of international students that the University intends to admit is calculated as an additional 10% (maximum) of the University's total enrollment vacancies for the academic year; this quantity should be submitted to the Ministry of Education for approval by November 30 of each year. The preceding total enrollment vacancies do not include international students without official student status.
- Article 4 International applicants who intend to apply to the University should submit the following forms and documents between January 1 and March 31 of each year to the University's Registration Section (students may apply for only one department or graduate institute). Applicants who pass their review of application qualifications will be issued a certificate of enrollment:
1. Application form: 2 copies.
 2. Highest academic degree attained at a foreign academic institution and associated official complete transcript that have been validated by ROC

embassies, consulates, representative offices, agencies or other organizations authorized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (hereinafter referred to as "representative office abroad"). If a document is in a language other than Chinese and English, a Chinese or English translation should be provided.

3. Health certificate (including HIV-related tests).
4. Financial statement validated by relevant ROC representative office abroad (to provide proof of adequate financial resources when studying in Taiwan).
5. Study plan in English or Chinese.

The highest academic degree attained at a foreign academic institution, as defined in subparagraph 2 of the preceding paragraph, should be recognized based on Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Credentials for Institutions of Higher Education. An international student who has completed a bachelor's or more advanced degree in Taiwan and wishes to continue his or her graduate studies (Master's or above) may apply for admission to a graduate program with the diploma awarded by the college or university in Taiwan, along with the official complete transcript, in which case subparagraph 2 of paragraph 1 above does not apply.

An international student must provide proof of insurance coverage such as medical and accident insurance and National Health Insurance at the time of registration; the insurance coverage should be effective throughout the entire period of the student's study in Taiwan. If no such proof is provided, the student will be required to pay insurance premiums at the time of registration for the enrollment in a mandatory insurance program.

Article 5 Qualifications submitted by an international applicant must first go through an initial review by the relevant department or institute. The University's International Students Admission Review Committee shall then conduct a second review. During the initial review phase the department or institute may notify and request that the applicant take a test on a professional subject or on Chinese language proficiency if necessary.

The "International Students Admission Review Committee" comprises the Dean of Academic Affairs and heads of departments and graduate institutes, with the Dean of Academic Affairs acting as the chairperson. Applicants who have passed the initial review will go on to the second phase of the review process. Each department and institute should compile a list of admitted students and submit it to the Academic Affairs Division for compilation by May 30 of each year. Each admitted international applicant will then be notified of their acceptance upon approval by the University President.

Article 6 After an international student has completed his or her program of study at a Taiwanese academic institution, he or she must follow the University's

International Students Admission Guidelines to pursue further studies at the Master's level or above. However, for additional programs of study below the Master's level, admission procedures for domestic students shall apply to the international student.

An international student who has previously been admitted to and enrolled in a Taiwanese college or university but was subsequently required to withdraw from the program may not apply to this University for admission under the provisions of these guidelines.

- Article 7 The registration and course selection procedures as well as the amount of tuition and fees or credit tuition that apply to international students are identical to those for ROC citizens. International students may also apply to the Ministry of Education for scholarships according to the provisions of the Ministry of Education Guidelines for the Award of Scholarships to Foreign Students.
- Article 8 An international student reporting to the University will not be allowed to enroll in the current academic year if one-third of the first semester of the academic year has elapsed; however, graduate students in Master's and Doctoral programs may begin enrollment in the second semester with consent of the heads of their graduate institutes.
- Prior to November 30 of each year, the University shall produce a roster of registered international students containing the name, nationality, year of study, enrolled department, institute or program for each student, with the information whether he or she is a recipient of the Taiwan Scholarship Program or international student scholarships sponsored by the Ministry of Education, and should be submitted and reported to the Ministry of Education for future reference.
- Article 9 International students may not apply for Taiwanese universities' undergraduate programs designed for returning education students, part-time Master's programs or other programs that offer courses taught only in the evenings or weekends. However, this rule does not apply in the event that an international student has applied for and received an Alien Resident Certificate or Permanent Resident Certificate, or is enrolled in an international program that has received special permission granted by the Ministry of Education.
- Article 10 The University's Registration Section (under Academic Affairs Division) is responsible for processing admission applications from international students. The day-to-day guidance and assessment of and communication with international students during their study at the University are handled jointly by the Student Affairs Division and the students' respective departments or institutes. Counseling events aimed at international students shall be held each academic year on an as-needed basis.
- In the event of an international student's leave of absence or withdrawal, or the

change or loss of his or her student status, the University should notify the Bureau of Consular Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the local National Immigration Agency service station, as well as the Ministry of Education.

Article 11 Matters not specified herein shall be governed by the Ministry of Education's Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan promulgated.

Article 12. These Guidelines become effective after they have been adopted or amended by the Academic Affairs Meeting, and reported to the Ministry of Education for future reference.

Establishment Directions for Tainan National University of the Arts International Student Scholarships

Approved by the 1st Administrative Meeting of the 2009 Academic Year held on August 5, 2009

Approved by the 10th Administrative Meeting of the 2009 Academic Year held on May 5, 2010

1. In coordination with the Ministry of Education's policy to expand the recruitment of foreign students by Taiwanese universities and to encourage outstanding foreign students to pursue their studies at the University, we have instituted the "Establishment Directions for Tainan National University of the Arts International Student Scholarships" (hereinafter referred to as the Directions).
2. The term "foreign students" used in these Directions refers to international students as defined in Article 2 of the "Tainan National University of the Arts International Students Admission Guidelines"; exchange students are excluded from this definition.
3. The number of awards, the amount of each award and manner of disbursement of the scholarships are as follows:
 - (1) Two undergraduate scholarships are available for each academic year; each scholarship recipient will receive the amount of NT\$30,000, to be disbursed equally between the first and second semesters.
 - (2) Two scholarships for students in Master's programs are available for each academic year; each scholarship recipient will receive the amount of NT\$60,000, to be disbursed equally between the first and second semesters.
 - (3) One scholarships for students in Doctoral programs are available for each academic year; each scholarship recipient will receive the amount of NT\$70,000, to be disbursed equally between the first and second semesters.
4. International students with official student status at the University may submit their scholarship applications if they meet the following eligibility requirements:
 - (1) The applicant has completed at least one academic year of coursework in an undergraduate program, with the number of credits taken in each semester conforming to the provisions of Article 11 of the University Regulations, and with an average grade of at least 75 in the previous semester. In addition, the student may not have received a reprimand or above from the University.
 - (2) The graduate level applicant has completed at least one academic year of coursework in a Master's or Doctoral program and has taken at least one course for each semester, with an average grade of at least 80 in the previous semester. In addition, the student may not have received a reprimand or above from the University.
 - (3) The applicant is enrolled in a Master's or Doctoral program. If the applicant has started writing his or her thesis or dissertation and did not take any courses in the previous

semester, then his or her average grade in the previous academic year shall be taken into consideration and the provisions in the preceding paragraph shall apply. The applicant must submit a recommendation letter from his or her advisor and a thesis/dissertation preparation plan (which should include research motivation and objectives, research framework and design, sources for data collection, outline of the thesis/dissertation, and references). In addition, the student may not have received a reprimand or above from the University. Each student may apply for scholarships in this category at most once only.

(4) The applicant is the head of a student organization with an average grade of at least 70 in the previous academic year, or, if the applicant is a graduate student, the average achieved must be at least 75. The applicant may submit the application with proof of his or her involvement in the student organization as its head, or with a report on the achievements of the organization under his or her leadership. Each student may apply for scholarships in this category at most once only.

5. Application Procedures:

(1) Applications for the scholarships are accepted and processed once in each academic year. Applications are accepted between October 1 and October 15 annually.

(2) Students who meet the eligibility requirements should prepare an application form (refer to Appendix 1), advisor's letter of recommendation, proof of academic performance, and proof of relevant outstanding work. These supporting documents should be submitted within the application period to the Office of International Affairs.

(3) Office of International Affairs shall compile all applications and submit them for review by the International Academic Exchange Review Committee. The following indicators and evaluation scheme shall apply when assessing the applications and awarding the scholarships, the winners of which shall be announced and notified.

1. Academic performance: 50% of the total score;

2. Other outstanding work: 40% of the total score;

3. Advisor's recommendation: 10% of the total score.

6. The International Academic Exchange Review Committee shall be chaired by the Director of the Office of International Affairs, with the Dean of Academic Affairs, the Dean of Student Affairs and Deans of relevant colleges serving as members of the committee.

7. Students who have received scholarships from Ministry of Education's Taiwan Scholarship Program or from the University are not eligible for these scholarships. Awardees will receive scholarship funding for a maximum of three years for undergraduates, three years for Master's programs, and four years for Doctoral programs.

8. The University may revoke a scholarship recipient's status if he or she is found to have not completed registration, have been suspended or taken leave of absence, withdrawn from the program, transferred to another institution, graduated, or resumed

studies following a suspension or leave of absence.

- 9 In the event that a recipient of this scholarship is found to have submitted forged documents or misrepresented himself or herself, the University reserves the right to revoke his or her scholarship status, and the recipient is required to return any amount that he or she has received from the scholarship to the University.
10. These Directions become effective after they have been adopted or amended by the Administrative Meeting and approved by the University President.
