I. Application Instructions

1. **Application Deadline : From January 5 (Monday) to March 31 (Tuesday), 2015.**

2. Application Procedure:

- (1) Determine whether the applicant is eligible under the Ministry of Education's Regulations Regarding International Student Undertaking Studies in Taiwan and Tainan National University of the Arts Regulations Regarding International Student Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.
- (2) Determine whether the academic program applied accepts international admissions.
- (3) For mailed applications, please mail all required documents to Registry Section Office of Academic Affairs Division Tainan National University of the Arts, No. 66, Daci Village, Guantian Dist., Tainan City 72045, postmarked by **March 31, 2015 (Tuesday)**. **Delivery services such as DHL or FedEx are recommended for international mailing.**
- (4) Eligibility review.
- (5) Required admission document review.
- (6) Admission committee review.
- (7) Admission list posted.
- (8) Admission notification mailed.

3. Qualifications

- (1) An individual of a foreign nationality who was never a holder of ROC citizenship (According to Article 2 of the Nationality Act) and does not have the Overseas Chinese status. An individual of foreign nationality, who has never held a nationality status from the Republic of China and who does not possess an overseas Chinese student status at the time of his/her application, is qualified to apply for admission under this regulation.
- (2) An individual of foreign nationality, pursuant to the following regulations and who has continuously stayed overseas for no less than 6 years, is also qualified to apply for admission under this regulation.
 1. An individual who has a nationality status from the Republic of China at the time of birth but does not hold a household registration must state this fact on the college application.
 2. An individual who has had nationality status from the Republic of China but has no R.O.C. nationality at the time of application shall have an annulled status regarding the R.O.C. nationality for no less than 8 years after an annulment of the R.O.C. nationality by the Ministry of the Interior.
 3. Regarding individuals mentioned in both of the above subparagraphs, they must not have studied in Taiwan under the status of an overseas Chinese nor received placement permission for an academic school year by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students.

Note 1: The six and eight year calculation period as prescribed above shall be calculated from the starting date of the semester (Aug. 1st) as the designated due date for the time of study.

Note 2: "Overseas" is limited to countries or regions other than Mainland China, Hong Kong and Macau; the term "continuously" means that an individual may stay in Taiwan for no more than a total of 120 days per calendar year. **When the duration of overseas stay falls in 2 calendar years, the duration of stay in Taiwan for each calendar year shall be deemed as less than 120 days.** The only exceptions to this method of calculation are for those who fulfill one of the following requirements with written supportive proof:

- a. Attended overseas youth training courses organized by the Overseas Compatriot Affairs Council or technique training classes accredited by the Ministry of Education (the "Ministry"):
- b. Attended a Mandarin Chinese language center at a university/college of which foreign student recruitment is approved by the Ministry, and to which the total length of stay is less than 2 years:
- c. Exchange students, whose length of total exchange is less than 2 years; or
- d. An Internship in Taiwan which has been approved by an authorized central government agency, to which the total length of stay is less than 2 years.

An applicant that holds a foreign citizenship and the permanent residency of Hong

Kong or Macau, having no history of household registration record in Taiwan, and at the time of application, has resided in Hong Kong, Macau or overseas continuously for no less than 6 years.

An applicant being a former citizen of Mainland China and holds a foreign nationality, having no history of household registration record in Taiwan, and at the time of application, has resided overseas continuously for no less than 6 years is qualified to apply for admission under these regulations. However, an individual who plans to apply for study at a department of medicine, dentistry, or Chinese medicine must reside overseas continuously for no less than 8 years.

Note 3: According to Article 2 of the Nationality Act, a person who meets one of the following requirements has acquired nationality of Republic of China :

(1) A person whose father or mother was, at the time of his (her) birth, a citizen of the Republic of China.

(2) A person born after the death of his (her) father or mother who was, at the time of his (her) death, a citizen of the Republic of China.

(3) A person born in the territory of the Republic of China and whose parents are both unknown or are stateless.

(4) A naturalized person.

(3) Qualifications for pursuing various degree programs:

1. Applicants who have graduated from a high school, college or university recognized by the

Ministry of Education, ROC can apply for admission. International students with a high school diploma are eligible to apply for undergraduate programs; bachelor's degree holders for Master's programs; Master's degree holders for doctoral programs.

2. Or other educational qualification equivalent to the requirements in the educational system in Taiwan.

(4) Must meet the application requirements of the individual departments in the brochure.

(5) International students who have received bachelor degrees or above in Taiwan and wish to continue to apply for master's program or above shall submit the diploma and transcripts from all school years and apply as required.

(6) For applicable rules and regulations, please refer to Ministry of Education's Regulations Regarding International Student Undertaking Studies in Taiwan and Tainan National University of the Arts Regulations Regarding International Student Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.

The applicant is responsible for making sure that the application is complete prior to mailing. Missing application, incomplete information or disqualifications are the sole responsibility of the applicant.

※Please keep copies of the application materials for future use if necessary. All submitted application materials become the property of the University and will not be returned regardless of the admission status.

Affairs. (Chinese translations must be provided for languages other than Chinese and English. The translations must be authenticated and sealed.)

- (7) **One Study Plan** in English or Chinese (Attachment 8).
- (8) **Two Letters of Recommendation** (Attachment 9).
【Departments that required 2 letters of recommendation: Applied Music Department, Art History Department, Graduate Institute of Applied Arts, Graduate Institute of Studies in Documentary and Film Archiving, Graduate Institute of Animation and Film Art, Graduate Institute of Art History and Art Criticism, Graduate Institute of Museology and Conservation of Cultural Relics, Graduate Institute of Ethnomusicology, Doctoral Program in Art Creation and Theory】
- (9) **Validated financial statement** certifying sufficient funds for the student's education in Taiwan or **certification of full scholarship provided by the government, educational institution or other private organizations.**
- (10) **Other Professional Evaluation Materials specified by each department (see P13~34 of this brochure).**
- (11) For those who once held dual-citizenship, provide a **copy of Certificate for Annulment of Nationality** issued by the Ministry of Interiors or **other documents certifying to the same effect.**

7. Application Instructions

- (1) **Starting from January 5, 2015, international students applying for admissions for the academic year 2015 shall follow the latest Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan posted on the website of the Ministry of Education for the required materials and related requirements. Please regularly visit the websites of the Ministry of Education and TNNUA**
(Website : http://www.edu.tw/content.aspx?site_content_sn=23092) .
- (2) The enrollment is handled in accordance with Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan issued by the Ministry of Education and TNNUA Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.
- (3) Diplomas and official transcripts submitted by the applicant must be authenticated by Taiwan Overseas Mission (with seals).
- (4) Overseas Chinese who are citizens of foreign countries but do not possess ROC nationality shall follow either these Regulations or the "Regulations for Overseas Chinese to Study in Taiwan" according to their choice. Those who violate the above-mentioned rules by applying for admission in the capacities of both overseas Chinese and foreigners will face immediate cancellation of their admission or the deprivation of their recognized status as TNNUA students, once their violation of regulations is discovered and confirmed.
- (5) As regulated by the Ministry of Education, international students who withdraw from a university/college after admission shall not apply for TNNUA under the Regulation Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan again. Students deemed in violation of this regulation will lose the admission status.
- (6) **The applicant may apply for a maximum of one degree program. Please review the application materials carefully. Once the application materials is confirmed and mailed, the application cannot be revoked, and the degree program cannot be changed for any reason.**
- (7) Applicants who are not accepted after the preliminary and secondary reviews will be notified separately by the Registry Section of TNNUA.
- (8) **Please keep a copy of all submitted materials (including the portfolio and study plan) for your record. They will become properties of the University after the evaluation and will not be returned regardless of the admission status.**
- (9) International students applying to study in Taiwan: (1) Students who have obtained the Bachelor's Degree in Taiwan and wish to continue studying in a Master program or above shall submit the diploma and transcript from a public or private university or an independent college acknowledged by the Ministry of Education in order to be exempt from the requirement of submitting the photocopy of the passport and academic certificate for degrees

obtained overseas. (2) For international students who wish to enroll in the Master or Doctoral programs, if the students have obtained a Bachelor's Degree or above from TNNUA and are able to provide the diploma and certificate of academic performance for said degree, they shall be exempt from the requirement of submitting the photocopy of passport and academic certificate for degrees obtained overseas.

- (10) If any document submitted is found to be false, forged, altered, or illegitimate, the admission will be canceled and registration denied. No degree certificate will be issued. If said incident is found after registration or graduation, the student status will be revoked and the degree diploma will be retracted. All the above-mentioned violations will be reported to the Ministry of Education, and criminal liability will be imposed.
- (11) International students shall not apply for any recurrent educational programs that TNNUA offers, which include the School of Continuing Education, In-service Master Programs or other programs conducted only in the evenings or weekends and holidays, with the exceptions of students who possess Alien Resident Certificates in Taiwan or Permanent Alien Resident Certificates, or who have studied in international programs offered by the university with special permission from the MOE.

8. Evaluation Date, Method and Location

- (1) Date: **April 7 to April 30, 2015 (Time as specified by each Department).**
- (2) Method: Based on the evaluation of the written information. (Evaluation will be made as specified by each Department. Please review the instructions from each Department in this brochure carefully. When necessary, the applicant may be notified to take the proficiency tests for professional subjects or Chinese proficiency test.)
- (3) Location: At each Department (Time and location as specified by each Department.)

9. Admission Requirements

- (1) Admission Standards:
 1. The admission list is determined by the International Student Admission Evaluation Committee after taking into consideration the results of the preliminary evaluation from each Department (Institute) and after determining the students qualified for the second evaluation. The International Student Admission Evaluation Committee shall determine the minimum admission standards prior to posting the acceptance list. Students who meet the minimum requirements but not admitted will be placed on the waiting list. When the admitted students forfeit the admission status, the status may be given to students on the waiting list until reaching the maximum enrollment quota. When the number of applicants meeting the minimum admission requirements is less than the enrollment quota, the applicant still may be rejected even even though the enrollment quota is not met.
 2. If the applicant is absent or has a zero score on any exams for the required subjects, the applicant will be disqualified.
- (2) Acceptance Announcement and Notification
 1. **Acceptance Announcement Date : By May 29, 2015 (Friday)**
 2. Announcement will be made on :

 3. Admission results and Check-in Notification will be mailed separately.

10. Check-in Instructions

- (1) Check-in : Check-in is notified by mail. Check-in Date: **July 10, 2015 (Friday) or as specified on the Check-in Notification.** Students who fail to report on time are deemed as forfeiting the admission status and replaced by a student from the waiting list without further objections.
- (2) Admitted students shall report to TNNUA and check in according to the rules specified on the admission notice and submit (verify) the following documents or the admission status will be revoked. Students who fail to check-in on time will be deemed as voluntarily forfeiting the admission status.

1. Original passport.
 2. **One photocopy and Chinese translation of the diploma from the highest degree institution authenticated by Taiwan Overseas Mission. (Must be stamped with the seal of the Overseas Mission)**
 3. **One copy of the official transcript for the highest degree authenticated and sealed by Taiwan Overseas Mission.** (Chinese translations must be provided for languages other than Chinese and English. The translations must be authenticated and sealed.)
 4. One copy of financial statement that certifies financial capability for studying in Taiwan.
 5. Proof of insurance:
 - (1) As required by Ministry of Education's Regulations Regarding International Student Undertaking Studies in Taiwan and Tainan National University of the Arts Regulations Regarding International Student Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, at the time of registration, international students must have gone through physical checkups and submit proof of insurance with medical and accident coverage effective for 6 months from the date the student arrives at Taiwan. Starting from the 5th month, international students shall be enrolled in the universal health insurance.
 - (2) The proof of insurance and records of physical checkup shall be verified by Taiwan Overseas Mission.
 - (3) It is mandatory for the uninsured to pay for the insurance premium and TNNUA shall apply on the student's behalf.
 - (4) For students who are uninsured, their enrollment eligibility shall be revoked.
- (3) Admitted students:** Please complete the check-in process by mail according to the time frame specified in the admission notification. Please submit a photocopy of the certificate of degree or the declaration if the student is unable to submit such certificate at this time. Said certificate may be submitted no later than the registration date for new students or the admission status will be revoked. Students who fail to check-in within the specified time frame shall forfeit the admission status without objections.

Students on the waiting list: Once admitted, students on the waiting list will be notified in order by the Recruitment Committee of Graduate Programs. The students must complete the check-in process in writing by mail within the specified time frame as indicated in the admission notification. The student shall submit a photocopy of the certificate of degree or the declaration if the student is unable to submit such certificate at this time. Said certificate may be submitted no later than the registration date for new students or the admission status will be revoked. Students who fail to check-in within the specified time frame shall forfeit the admission status without objections. This process will continue until the first day of class for the first semester of the 2015 academic year (**Mid - September**).

- (4) Should students who have submitted the application or have been admitted to TNNUA found to be ineligible for application, or should the materials submitted found to be forged, fake, or false, they will face immediate cancellation of their admission or the deprivation of their recognized status as TNNUA students. No certificate of degree will be issued. If such incident is found after graduation, the diploma must be returned and the degree canceled.
- (5) **After the acceptance list is posted, admitted students and students on the waiting list shall complete the check-in process within the specified time frame even if the students did not receive the check-in notification prior to the check-in date. Students who fail to complete the check-in process within the specified time frame may not be excused for any reason, and the admission status shall be revoked. Admission status of students on the waiting list who fail to complete the check-in process on time shall also be revoked.**

11. Registration

- (1) TNNUA will mail registration information to admitted students by **July 31, 2015** and the fee statement in a separate mailing in **August**. Information for New Students will also be posted on the website of Academic Affairs. Admitted students shall complete the reporting and

check-in process as regulated by TNNUA. Those who fail to do so will have their admission status revoked without objections.

- (2) When applying for the student visa, applicants must submit the health certificate (including HIV, measles, a positive test result on rubella antibody or proof of vaccination) issued by a hospital to the Taiwan Overseas Mission.
- (3) At the time of registration, new international students shall submit proof of medical and accident insurance (verified by Taiwan Overseas Mission) with a minimum of 6-month-coverage starting from the date the student arrives in Taiwan. Students already enrolled shall submit proof of enrollment in the National Health Insurance. The insured period must cover the entire school enrollment period. Students who are not yet insured (only for those who have been admitted) may pay for the insurance premium at the time of registration and TNNUA shall process the insurance matter on the student's behalf. Proof of insurance issued overseas shall be verified by Taiwan Overseas Mission.
- (4) International student will be allowed to register for the first semester should the student's arrival time dates within one-third period of the first semester. International students will be allowed to register for the second semester should the student's arrival dates over one third period of the first semester.
- (5) Admitted students shall make payments for the tuition and fees, register for courses and complete the registration and enrollment process or the admission status shall be revoked and given to the student on the waiting list.
- (6) Once admitted, the student's study and student status shall be governed by the regulations promulgated by the Ministry of Education and TNNUA.
- (7) Once registered, the required courses, credit hours and qualifications for graduation shall follow the regulations of each degree program.
- (8) For issues not covered in this admission packet, please refer to Ministry of Education's Regulations Regarding International Student Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Credentials for Institutions of Higher Education, Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Academic Credentials for Institutions in Mainland China, Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Credentials for Institutions in Hong Kong and Macau, and Tainan National University of the Arts Regulations Regarding International Student Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, or they shall be determined by the Admissions Committee.

13. Dormitory and Fees

- (1) All dormitories are air-conditioned. The electricity bill is calculated according to the electricity meter. An advance payment for the electricity will be listed on the statement of registration fees. The difference between the advance payment and the actual bill will be paid or returned when the semester ends.
- (2) Dormitory Assignment :
 1. Students in the graduate programs will be assigned to the rooms with 2 beds in Dormitory 1 and Dormitory 5.
 2. Students in the undergraduate program will be assigned to the rooms with 2, 3 or 4 beds in Dormitories 3, 4, 5, and 6. The rooms will be assigned by the Office of Student Affairs Division according to the number of students. (Department of Applied Music — Dormitories 3 and 4; Department of Material Arts and Design, Department of Art History

- Dormitories 5 and 6; Department of Chinese Music – Dormitories 4 and 5; Department of Music — Dormitory 4.)

(3) Rooms in Dormitory 5 are private rooms (with bathroom), the rest are regular rooms.

(4) Dormitory fees per student for each semester :

(5) The above listed fees are for the rooms only, a one-time room deposit of NT\$1,500 and an advance electricity payment of NT\$ 800 will be listed on the statement for registration fees.

Article 1

In compliance with Article 6 of Ministry of Education Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, the university stipulated the “Tainan National University of the Arts Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan” (hereinafter referred to as the “Regulations”).

Article 2

An individual of foreign nationality, who has never held nationality status from the Republic of China (“R.O.C.”) and who does not possess an overseas Chinese student status at the time of their application, is qualified to apply for admission under this regulation.

An individual of foreign nationality, pursuant to the following requirements and who has resided overseas continuously for no less than 6 years is also qualified to apply for admission under this regulation. However, an individual who plans to apply for study at a department of medicine, dentistry or Chinese medicine must have resided overseas continuously for no less than 8 years.

1. An individual who also is a national of the R.O.C. , but does not hold or has had a household registration in Taiwan.
2. An individual who also was a national of the R.O.C. but has no R.O.C. nationality at the time of

their application shall have an annulled status regarding their R.O.C. nationality for no less than 8 years after an annulment of R.O.C. nationality by the Ministry of the Interior.

3. Regarding individuals mentioned in the preceding 2 subparagraphs, they must not have studied in Taiwan as an overseas Chinese student nor received placement permission during the same year of the application by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students.

According to the Education Cooperation Framework Agreement, a foreign national who was selected by a foreign government, organization, or school, and does not hold a household registration from the time of their birth is not subject to the limitations as prescribed in the preceding 2 paragraphs after receiving the approval from the authorized educational government agencies. If the calculated calendar year is not one complete calendar year, their stay in Taiwan should not exceed 120 days within the calculated calendar year period.

The six and eight year calculation period as prescribed in Paragraph 2 shall be calculated from the starting date of the semester (February 1st or August 1st) as the designated due date for the time of study.

The term “overseas” as prescribed in Paragraph 2 is limited to countries or regions other than Mainland China, Hong Kong and Macau; the term “reside overseas continuously” means that an individual may stay in Taiwan for no more than a total of 120 days per calendar year.

The only exceptions to this method of calculation are for those who fulfill one of the following requirements with written supported proof:

1. Attended overseas youth training courses organized by the Overseas Compatriot Affairs Council or technique training classes accredited by the Ministry of Education (the “Ministry”);
2. Attended a Mandarin Chinese language center at a university/college of which foreign student recruitment is approved by the Ministry, and to which the total length of stay is less than 2 years;
3. Exchange students, whose length of total exchange is less than 2 years; or
4. An Internship in Taiwan which has been approved by an authorized central government agency, to which the total length of stay is less than 2 years.

An individual, who has both foreign and R.O.C. nationalities and has applied for an annulment of their R.O.C. nationality before February 1, 2011, the effective date of this amendment, will then be qualified to apply for admission as an international student under the amendment effective before February 1, 2011 and will not be subject to the limitation as prescribed in Paragraph 2.

Article 3

An applicant of foreign nationality, concurrently holding a permanent residence status in Hong Kong or Macao, having no history of a household registration record in Taiwan and, at the time of application, has resided in Hong Kong, Macao, or another foreign country for no less than 6 years is qualified to apply for admission under these regulations. However, an individual who plans to apply for study at a department of medicine, dentistry, or Chinese medicine must reside overseas continuously for no less than 8 years.

The term “reside overseas continuously” mentioned in the preceding paragraph means an individual may stay in Taiwan for no more than a total of 120 days per calendar year. However, such a term

may be exempt, if any of the conditions prescribed in Subparagraphs 1 through 4, Paragraph 5 of the previous Article applies and is supported with written proof, and the said domestic length of stay shall be excluded from the overseas length of residency.

An applicant being a former citizen of Mainland China and holds a foreign nationality, having no history of household registration record in Taiwan, and at the time of application, has resided overseas continuously for no less than 6 years is qualified to apply for admission under these regulations. However, an individual who plans to apply for study at a department of medicine, dentistry, or Chinese medicine must reside overseas continuously for no less than 8 years.

The term “reside overseas continuously” means an individual may stay in Taiwan for no more than a total of 120 days per calendar year.

However, such a term may be exempted if any of the conditions prescribed in Subparagraphs 1 through 4, of Paragraph 5 of the previous Article, applies and is supported with written proof, and the said domestic length of stay shall be excluded from the overseas length of residency.

The six and eight years calculation period as prescribed in Paragraph 1 and Paragraph 3 shall be calculated from the starting date of the semester (February 1st or August 1st) as the designated due date for the time of study.

The term overseas as prescribed in paragraph 5 in previous article shall apply to paragraphs 1 to 4.

Article 4

International students applying for schools in Taiwan in accordance with the two previous articles shall be limited to one application only. Upon completion of the course of study, at a school in Taiwan, to which an international student has applied, the student's admission to another school's academic level shall be handled in a manner identical to the admission procedures for local students. An exception is that an application for a master's degree or higher levels of graduate studies can be processed under the procedures of each individual school.

Article 5

The quotas for admission allocated for international students at this university, should be additional quotas but be no more than ten percent of the number of positions allocated for this school for local students each year. The number should be calculated into the total number of positions at each school, yearly and reported to the authorized educational government agencies for ratification.

If the quotas for admission, which have been allocated for local students, have not been filled, a university/college may fill the quotas with international students according to the total number of designated yearly positions.

The quotas for admission prescribed in Paragraph 1, do not include international students with a non-degree status.

Article 6

This university will follow these regulations for international student recruitment.

Universities/colleges shall set up accordingly a Recommendation and Review Committee, which consists of the principal (also convener), dean of each college, chairman of each department, chief comptroller, head of the recruitment section of the office of academic affairs; recruitment should be open, fair and justified, and be announced in the recruitment guidebook.

The university shall set up accordingly a set of entrance procedures that outline the degree programs offered, the duration of study, quotas for admission, qualifications and requirements, reviewing or screening methods, along with other related information.

Article 7

International students applying for admission to universities/colleges shall submit their applications during application period 1 January and 31 March of every year, and send the following documents to the registrar's office (one department at a time). Those applicants that qualify through the review or screening process will be granted admission by the school. The following application documents need to be submitted:

1. Application form

2. Academic credentials:

(1) Academic credentials from Mainland China: The Regulations Governing the Accreditation of Schools in Mainland China shall apply.

(2) Academic credentials from Hong Kong or Macao: Academic Credential Verification and Accreditation Methods adopted in Hong Kong and Macao shall apply.

(3) Academic credentials from other areas:

A. Academic credentials earned at overseas Taiwan schools or Taiwan schools in Mainland China shall be regarded as the same as those at domestic schools with equivalent levels.

B. Academic credentials referred to the preceding 2 Items shall be subject to the Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Credentials for Institutions of Higher Education. However, academic credentials earned from institutes or branches established in Mainland China by foreign schools shall require public notarization in Mainland China and be verified and examined by an institute established or appointed by, or through a private agency commissioned by the Executive Yuan.

3. Financial proof that shows financial sustainability for study in Taiwan, or proof of full scholarship provided by a government agency, university, college, or private organization.

4. Others as required by the respective schools.

When the school reviews the application documents without verification by overseas consulates, representative offices, agencies of the country or other bodies authorized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (hereinafter referred to as 'Overseas Agencies') or institutes established or appointed by, or a private agency commissioned by the Executive Yuan as prescribed in subparagraphs 2 and 4 of the preceding paragraph may request for verification by an Overseas Agencies. If the said documents have been verified, the school may request examination of the documents.

Article 7-1 An international student submitting forged, fabricated, or altered papers for the purpose of their school application shall be subject to enrollment qualification cancellation; or a revocation of enrollment and denial to the request of any certificate pertaining to study, if the said student is already enrolled; or revocation of graduation qualifications and cancellation of the diploma by the student's school, if the said student has been already graduated.

Article 8

The university offering admission to international students shall promptly register into the international student data management information system the following: school entrance, transfer, suspension or dismissal and any change or loss of student status.

Article 9

The qualification for international students who applied for enrollment is determined by the first screening session, then the review session by the International Student Recruitment Recommendation and Review Committee. Each department should contact the applicant to take the professional subjects exam or the Chinese language proficiency test if deemed necessary.

Article 10

An international student reporting to a university, college, five-year program in junior college, elementary schools through senior high schools for registration at the time not beyond one-third of the first semester of the current school year shall register for the first semester; or at the time beyond one third of the first semester of the current school year shall register for the second semester or the next school year, unless otherwise stipulated by the authorized educational government agencies.

Article 11

Fees that are to be paid by international students in Taiwan should be calculated by using the following:

1. Students who are admitted to study in Taiwan pursuant to the previous 2 articles, or are recipients of MOFA Taiwan Scholarships, under the recommendation of the designated overseas agencies, or holders of the status of permanent residents in our country shall pay their tuition and other fees in accordance with the same standards that apply to Taiwan nationals.
 2. Students admitted to educational institutions in Taiwan in accordance with an education cooperation agreement shall pay their tuition and other fees that are specified in the agreement.
 3. A school that accepts an international student who does not qualify to the preceding 2 Subparagraphs may apply its own tuition and other fees standard to the said student, and the said standard may not be lower than the standard adopted by other private schools at the same level.
- Students that were admitted to study in Taiwan before the effective date of the February 1, 2011 amendment shall pay for their own tuition and other fees in accordance with the previous

standards.

Article 12

International students may not apply for Extension Programs at universities/colleges designed for returning education students, part time, in-service courses of Master programs, or other programs, which are restricted to night classes and classes during holidays. International students who have obtained legal resident status of Taiwan, or are enrolled in a program ratified by this Ministry, are exempted from this Article.

Article 13

An international student who has been approved for an internship after their graduation from a university in Taiwan may have his or her international student status may be extended for one year at most after graduation.

During the course of study in Taiwan, international students, who have undertaken initial household registration, resident registration, naturalization or restoration of the R.O.C. nationality, will lose their international student status and shall be dismissed by the school.

International students who are dismissed from university/college after admission due to behavior issues, poor academic performance or a conviction under the Criminal Law may thereafter not apply for admission under this regulation.

A university or college shall integrate the procedures regarding how to accept international students transferring into its international recruitment guidelines, which will be subject to the Ministry's approval. However, an international student that has been dismissed by a school that accepts the said student, due to behavior issues or a conviction under the Criminal Law may not transfer to another university or college.

International students who want to transfer to the school must abide the school's "Transfer Student Recruitment Regulations". However, an international student that has been dismissed by a school that accepts the said student, due to behavior issues or a conviction under the Criminal Law will not be admitted.

Article 14

The university may sign education cooperation agreements with foreign schools and recruit international exchange students. The university may apply this regulation to accept international students as non-degree seeking students with the condition that it will not compromise normal teaching routines.

With approval from the authorized educational government agencies, elementary schools through senior high schools may recruit international students for short-term periods of study of less than one year in Taiwan.

Article 15

Schools of all levels establishing special international student programs under international

academic cooperation programs or special circumstances shall comply with their respective total quantity development scale and follow the regulations governing resource conditions, in addition to filing an application with the authorized educational government agencies which will be subject to approval from the Ministry.

Article 16

The university shall provide funds for setting up scholarships or financial aid to encourage international students that are studying in Taiwan.

Article 17

The university's office of academic affairs registrar division is responsible for handling international student applications. The university's office of academic affairs and each department is responsible for academic consultation, performance assessment, and contact matters. In addition, these units or personnel shall reinforce the arrangement of home stay lodging for international students, and assist them to learn Mandarin Chinese and Taiwan culture in order to better enhance their understanding about Taiwan.

Universities/colleges shall host activities to foster international exchange, globalization on campus, or other events helpful to interactions between international and local students, during each school year.

If international students discontinue their schooling or because of any other reason that causes them to change or lose their student status at the school, the school must notify the Bureau of Consular Affairs of the Ministry of the Foreign Affairs, the Service Center of National Immigration Agency, the Ministry of the Interior, and send copies of these notifications to the Ministry of Education.

Article 18

International students who follow the regulations can apply for scholarship according to the "Tainan National University of the Arts Regulations on International Student Scholarship".

Article 19

If international students violate the Employment Services Act, Schools or authorized authorities shall immediately handle the cases in accordance with the related regulations after investigation.

Article 20

Please refer to Ministry of Education Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan for the regulations unmentioned here.

Article 21

These regulations and future amendments shall be approved by the Academic Affairs Meeting, and will take effect on the day of the approval of the Ministry of Education.

Regulations on International Student Scholarship

Passed at the 1st Administrative Meeting on August 5, 2009
Amended and Passed at the 10th Administrative Meeting on May 5, 2010
Amended and Passed at the 7th Administrative Meeting on April 11, 2012
Amended and Passed at the 5th Administrative Meeting on December 4, 2013

Article 1

In compliance with the policy of the Ministry of Education to increase recruitment of international students, and to encourage outstanding students to study at this school, the university has hereby established “Tainan National University of the Arts Regulations on International Student Scholarship” (hereinafter referred to as the “Regulations”).

Article 2

The definition of international students refers to international students who apply for enrollment according to the regulations of Article 2-1 and 2-2 of “Tainan National University of the Arts Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan”.

Article 3

Duration of Scholarships:

- (i) The maximum period of each scholarship is four years for undergraduate programs, two years for master programs, and four years for doctorate programs. The maximum length of the total awards for each recipient undertaking a combination of studies is five years.
- (ii) Subsistence allowances begin from the month of the recipients’ registration at the universities/colleges and end when the award period expires or upon the recipients’ graduation, withdrawal, suspension, expulsion, or revocation of the scholarship.

Article 4

Scholarship Quota and Amount are as follows:

- (i) Six persons per semester for bachelors degree, each recipient NTD40, 000; seven persons per semester for masters and doctorate degree, each recipient NTD60,000.
- (ii) Recipients of the scholarship must apply for registration that current year to receive the scholarship.
- (iii) The total budget of the school’s international student scholarship and scholarship quota of each educational system are contingent upon the annual budget allotments for the coming year and each representative office’s yearly performance.

Article 5

Eligibility:

- (i) New students: international students who applied for registration according to Article 2 of this regulation and passed the review of the recruitment committee can apply for scholarship. International academic exchange review committee selects and approve the recipient list, announces and contacts the recipient.
- (ii) Former students: international students who attended at least one semester at the university. Applicants are ineligible if they meet the following criteria:

1. Bachelor student: must have taken at least 16 course credits the previous semester, and attained a minimum average 75%, and has never been detained by the university.
2. Research student (including Masters and Doctorate students): must have taken at least two courses the previous semester, and attained a minimum average of 80%, and has never been detained by the university.
3. Research students (including Masters and Doctorate students) who have already completed their course credits and don't have a grade from the previous semester from writing their thesis, can use the total average of the previous semester, along with the research advisor's letter of recommendation and thesis research proposal to apply for scholarship, as long as it is consistent with the previous statement in the regulation.
4. Students who held the position of the representative leader of a student group, and attained a minimum average 70% (75% for Masters and Doctorate students) the previous semester, can apply with the proof of responsibility and present a report on the outcome of their student activities. This type of application can only be used once.

Article 6

Application period and approval process:

- (i) Scholarships are handed out each semester, twice a year during Spring and Fall.
- (ii) New students: with cooperation with the recruitment session that year, one may apply according to the announcement period provided by the International Exchange Center.
- (iii) Old students: one may apply to the International Exchange Center every year between 15 September to 30 September.

Article 7

Application documents:

- (i) New students: according to the method announced by the International Academic Exchange Center.
- (ii) Old students:
 1. Application provided by the International Academic Exchange Center
 2. One letter of recommendation (by homeroom teacher or research advisor)
 3. Proof of transcript of the previous semester
 4. Creative work collection and other professional performance that are notable for the review.

Article 8

Selection Criteria:

- (i) New students: members of the recipient list are selected and approved by the International Academic Exchange Review Committee.
- (ii) Old students: members of the recipient list are selected and approved by the International Academic Exchange Review Committee under the following criteria:
 1. Academic average (40%)
 2. Creative art collection and other professional performance (60%)

Article 9

According to Article 3 of National Tainan University of Arts International Exchange Scholarship Plan Review Regulations, the International Academic Exchange Review Committee consists of the Recommendation and Review Committee, which consists of the International Exchange Center director as the chairman, head of academic affairs, head of student affairs, and related heads of the department/

Article 10

Those who already attained MOE's Taiwan Scholarship or the school's scholarship is not allowed to reapply for the scholarship of this regulation. If violated and discovered, one should return the scholarship fund.

Article 11

Students approved of the scholarship but did not complete registration that year, or applied to reserve admission, suspension, withdrawal, transfer or graduation will be cancelled their qualification. Students who return after suspension also annulled the qualification for scholarship.

Article 12

If recipients of the scholarship has been discovered of forgery or untruthful situations, the school can revoke the qualification for the award. Those who already received the scholarship should return it to the school.

Article 13

These regulations and future amendments shall be approved by the Administrative Committee, and will take effect on the day of promulgation by Principle Chen.

Ministry of Foreign Affairs Taiwan Scholarship (International Students)

Ministry of Foreign Affairs (hereinafter referred to as the Ministry) of the Republic of China (hereinafter referred to as R.O.C.) promulgated this set of regulations in order to execute the Taiwan Scholarship program (hereinafter referred to as the Scholarship) and encourage outstanding international students to study in Taiwan and promote exchanges and friendship.

This regulation is not applicable to students from China, Hong Kong and Macau.

1. The Scholarship includes:

- (1) NT\$25,000 per month when fulfilling the prerequisite courses for Chinese.
- (2) NT\$30,000 per month throughout the degree program.
- (3) The recipient must pay for all expenses during the stay in Taiwan. The Ministry will not provide any other subsidy.
- (4) The Ministry will provide 1 one-way economy class ticket for each recipient for the most direct flight each way between Taiwan and the applicant's native country.

2. Eligibility:

- (1) International students with high school diploma or above and graduated with good academic and moral performance.
- (2) The applicant is not a citizen of the Republic of China.
- (3) The applicant is not a overseas student of the Republic of China.
- (4) The applicant has no prior experience of pursuing the same degree program in Taiwan.
- (5) The applicant is not an exchange student admitted under any academic collaboration agreements made between a foreign school and any college or university in Taiwan during the scholarship period.
- (6) The applicant's eligibility for scholarship has never been revoked by any governmental or related agencies of the Republic of China.

3. Others:

4. Application Period: Between February 1 and April 30 each year.

5. The applicant shall submit related documents to the Taiwan Overseas Mission (or the organization with such jurisdictional capacity) in his/her native countries or its territory prior to the application deadline.

Ministry of Education Taiwan Scholarship

※Encourage students from countries with no diplomatic relations with Taiwan (excluding China, Hong Kong and Macau) to pursue bachelor, master and doctoral programs in Taiwan.

1. Scholarship:

- (1) Each recipient shall receive the following:
 - (i) Full tuition reimbursement and some of the miscellaneous fees.
 - (ii) NT\$15,000 in stipend for undergraduate students and NT\$20,000 for students in Master's and PhD programs.
- (2) The scholarship period:
 - (i) The maximum scholarship period for undergraduate students are 4 years, 2 years for master's students and 4 years for PhD students. However, the accumulative total scholarship period shall not exceed 5 years.

2. Eligibility:

- (1) International students with high school diploma or above and graduated with good academic and moral performance.
- (2) Persons meeting one of the followings are not eligible to apply:
 - (i) The applicant is a citizen of the Republic of China or an overseas student of the Republic of China.
 - (ii) The applicant has retained student status or has registered for courses in colleges or universities in the Republic of China. However, graduating students who applied for a higher degree are not bound by this restriction.
 - (iii) The applicant has prior record of pursuing the same degree program in Taiwan.
 - (iv) The applicant is an exchange student or dual degree student admitted under any academic collaboration agreements made between a foreign school and any college or university in Taiwan during the scholarship period.
 - (v) The applicant is a recipient of any scholarships from this program for over 5 years.
 - (vi) The applicant's eligibility for scholarship had been revoked by any governmental or related agencies of the Republic of China.
 - (vii) The scholarship or financial assistance the applicant receives from the R.O.C. government or school include the subsidy provided the school in conjunction with the scholarship program to cover the miscellaneous fees that exceed the maximum limit posed by the Ministry.
